#### Course Description

There are 9 Major Units of learning in this class, all designed to give students an overview of the history of the founding of the United States. Each unit will consist of in-class activities and end-of-unit tests. There may also be smaller quizzes in each unit as well. Some units will involve larger projects.

## Grading

Student grades are an average of class work, quizzes, tests and projects. Class work tends to be the deciding factor for most students as to whether or not they get a good grade, even if they tend to do poorly on tests. This means that typically students who do their work to completion, correct their mistakes when given the opportunity, and turn in their work by the due date do not have issues with low grades, even if they struggle on tests.

<u>In-class Work</u>: 5-50 points per assignment (Approximately 8-10 per 9 weeks)

<u>Quizzes</u>: 10-50 points per assignment (Approximately 2-4 per nine weeks)

Tests: 100 points (Approximately 2 per nine weeks)

Homework should not be expected unless a student does not finish their work in class. Extra Credit is not given often and will not be offered to students who have zeros for regular credit assignments. If assignments are turned in late, students will see a reduction in their grade, depending on how late the assignment was and the circumstances surrounding the late assignment. If turning in work late becomes a consistent problem, students can expect to have to stay after school for detention in order to be able to turn in their assignment.

# How to Know What's Going On

- 4. Visit the **class websites** for teachers who have them available to access class documents, assignments and supplemental material.
- 5. Check the **WHMS Facebook page** or school website for updates and announcements.
- 6. If you have questions or concerns, **email** your student's teachers first. If the issue is something that cannot be addressed well via email, call our front desk to **schedule an appointment for a conference**.
